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Uncommon Commonalities By Melinda Bossenmeyer, Ed.D.

- I. Students form a large circle arms length apart.
- 2. The first person says, "I have brown hair."
- 3. That is the cue for all the students with brown hair to skip across the center of the circle to the other side.
- 4. The caller picks the next caller who makes a true statement. The caller should think of fun things to call. Ie "This summer we went to Hawaii." That is the cue for anyone else who went to Hawaii to skip across the circle.
- 5. Game continues. After a few minutes of playing, you may want to encourage children to name activities that they think are unique to them.
- 6. Everyone wins. Encourage participation in this get-toknow-you game.



Name Bingo

No Equipment Needed & No Prep Bingo Sheet Included

- I. Pass out the Name Bingo paper to each student.
- 2. The object is to be the first person to complete the bingo sheet.
- 3. Explain that students must find someone that fits the description written in a box.
- 4. Have that person sign their name in the box.
- 5. Each person can sign only one box on each person's paper.
- 6. All boxes should be filled with different names.
- 7. First person to fill in all boxes on the Bingo paper wins.

- I. Form a large circle arms length apart.
- 2. All players have 5 fingers to begin with. (Or 4 fingers and their thumb).
- 3. The first person starts and says, "Never have I ever_____," and fills in the blank.
- 4. For example, if the students says, "Never have I ever rode a horse," then everyone who has must put a finger down.
- 5. The game continues and the person on the right is next. He says, "Never have I ever _____." The student calling an activity is trying to say things that he hasn't done and that others have in order to stay in the game and get others out.
- 6. Game continues. After a couple of kids run out of fingers start the game over again with everyone in.
- 7. Everyone wins. Just encourage participation in this get-to-know-you game.



fill stand by you No Equipment Needed & No Prep


- I. Make 2 lines down the center of the room. (You can use a chair and students stand on right or left of the chair facing the other line.)
- 2. Read the attached list of statements.
- 3. The left line is "like" and the right line is for "dislike".
- 4. Read a statement and students stand on the side of the line that represents their likes or dislikes.
- This is a fun game without winners. Students get to know each other and their "likes" and "dislikes" a little better.
